On May 14th, 2011 Austin Whitney walked across the stage and received his diploma from UC Berkeley. This doesn't sound like anything extraordinary, but for those who know Austin's story, it is. Four years ago Austin learned a really hard lesson that he will never be able to take back. He was driving drunk and wrapped his car around a tree. He severed his spinal cord just below the hip. He spent 41 days in the hospital and 10 days after being released he was attending college. He had started his freshman year and double majored in history and political science. A team of graduate students developed the wearable robotic skeleton. This robotic skeleton not only got Austin to stand, but to walk across the stage to receive his diploma. Graduation is a huge achievement for anyone, but for Austin his graduation consisted of a miracle. In reading this story, I was overwhelmed with joy for Austin, but all the people that helped him get there. These are the stories people read and understand why teachers, professors, superintendents, principles, aides, business administrators, and all the others involved in education do what they do. Education was the drive behind this entire story. The education the graduate students received helped them build this robotic skeleton for Austin.
