# APPLICATION AND SELECTION PROCEDURES

### CANDIDATES SHOULD SUBMIT A FORMAL APPLICATION, WHICH INCLUDES:

- 1. A letter setting forth in detail their:
  - a. Personal philosophy of education.
  - b. Special competencies which qualify them for the superintendency.
  - c. Interest in this particular position.
- 2. A current resume in which professional preparation, experience, and a record of scholarly achievement are clearly detailed.
- 3. A minimum of four current Letters of Recommendation.
- 4. Transcripts of all college and university credits.
- 5. A Superintendent Application Form completed in full. This form is available on the Utah School Boards Association (USBA) website at www.usba.cc

Applications will be reviewed as they are received, and each candidate will be informed concerning the receipt of the application materials.

The Piute County Board of Education will individually review applications of all candidates. After reviewing applications and qualifications, the board may gather additional data concerning candidates.

Finalist candidates will be invited for interviews. The Board will then select the candidate of its choice for the position.

All candidates will be notified concerning the Board's choice, and the Board will introduce the new Superintendent to the community in an appropriate setting.

The starting date for the new Superintendent is July 1, 2012.

# ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. The Board shall employ a Superintendent of Schools for such term as may be provided by law and such compensation as it may determine.
- 2. The Superintendent of Schools shall be the executive and administrative officer of the Board of Education. He/she acts under delegated authority of the Board, except in the preparation of the budget.
- 3. As the executive and administrative officer of the Board, he/she shall have the supervision and the direction of the entire school system.
- 4. The candidate shall be present at all meetings of the Board except when his/her own election, tenure, efficiency, or salary is being discussed.
- 5. The candidate shall be directly responsible to the Board for the conduct of the schools and for such duties pertaining thereto, as the Board may direct.
- 6. With the advice and consent of the Board and with assistance of the principals, he/she shall nominate, assign, and transfer all teachers and other employees and delegate to them their responsibility.
- 7. The candidate shall provide, with the assistance of principals, a system for evaluating the services of teachers. All applications for position in the school system shall be referred to him/her.
- 8. He/she shall fill vacancies during the school year as they may occur until a subsequent meeting of the Board, and shall make such other temporary arrangements or adjustments of the school program as he/she may deem proper.

- 9. In collaboration with the professional members of the staff, the superintendent shall continuously initiate and present to the Board such policies and plans as will serve to improve the public schools.
- 10. The candidate shall make such reports to the Board of the conditions of the schools that he/she may deem necessary or that the Board may request.
- 11. He/she shall inform the Board frequently, and in as much detail as consistent with an adequate understanding of the progress of the school and the activities of its agents.
- 12. The candidate shall prepare the annual budget and present it in accordance with the law and shall serve as budget officer of the school district; and shall exercise general supervision of the business of the school system.
- 13. He/she shall promote in-service training of personnel; recommend salary schedules, textbooks, school supplies, and equipment.
- 14. The candidate shall give such instructions to school employees as may be necessary to make fully effective these policies, and any additional instruments of control established by the Board.
- 15. In all matters not covered by these regulations, he/she shall act on his/her own discretion if action is necessary; but shall report his/her action to the Board for its information and approval.
- 16. The candidate shall perform such other duties as he/she may deem advisable or as may be required of him/her by the Board or by law.

#### **PIUTE AT A GLANCE**

Junction is the County seat of Piute County and is located on scenic, historic Highway 89 in Central Utah. Highway 89 is the gateway to many Utah National Parks including Bryce (57 miles), Cedar Breaks (85 miles), Zion (100 miles) and the North Rim of the Grand Canyon (183 miles).

On April 21, 1869, Probate Judge Joseph H. Wing, proceeded to organize the County of Piute, Territory of Utah, at Bullion City. The name Piute was taken from the Piute Indian Tribe, the name Bullion from the gold-laden mountains of the Tushar Range. Today Bullion City no longer exists but Piute County is one of Utah's most promising counties.

Junction is surrounded by the Fish lake National Forest and other recreational lands. Activities in the area include hiking, fishing, canoeing, skiing, hunting and ATV trail riding. All of these recreational activities are local and all are nearby. Junction is a stop on the famous Piute ATV trail and is centrally located to all riding areas (15 miles south of Marysvale, 40 miles south of Richfield).

Agriculture has long been a mainstay in the Piute County economy. Livestock and dairying have been the major emphasis in agricultural activities. With the recent rapid rises in meat prices and the steady although less spectacular rises in dairy prices, the emphasis will undoubtedly be even more on livestock and dairying. Hay, grain and pasture have been principal crops and all are produced to be used in livestock and dairy production.

Piute County is blessed with pure air, clean, clear water, many national parks and beautiful mountain scenery. Piute is rich with natural resources for improved agriculture, increased mining activity, and unlimited development possibilities for outdoor recreation. With a ready, capable, and willing labor force looking for expanded job opportunities, Piute County has a promising future.
