A. Legislative Obligations

- 1. Fully Fund Enrollment Growth, estimated to be 13,000, which also includes a percentage of new funding (representing the percentage of new enrollment growth) to the following programs and services so as to continue current services to children (not necessarily in priority order):
 - a. Administrative Costs
 - b. Adult Education
 - c. Board and Local Levy Program
 - d. Career and Technical Education
 - e. Class Size Reduction
 - f. Concurrent Enrollment
 - g. Dual Language Immersion
 - h. Early Intervention
 - i. Educator Salary Adjustments
 - j. Enhancement for Accelerated Students
 - k. Enhancement for Students At-Risk

- I. Flexible Allocation WPU Distribution
- m. Guarantee Transportation Levy
- n. K-3 Reading Improvement Program
- o. Library Resources
- p. Matching Funds for School Nurses
- q. Necessarily Existent Small Schools
- r. Professional Staff Costs
- s. Special Education
- t. Teacher Supplies
- u. Transportation (To and From)
- v. Youth in Custody
- 2. Fully fund Utah Retirement Systems (URS) rate increase as a line item appropriation.

B. Requests for Additional Funding

- 1. Increase the Weighted Pupil Unit (WPU) to keep pace with comparable salaries and health benefits, instructional materials, software, computers, infrastructure, and student learning needs.
- 2. Fund Strategically Targeted Professional Development for Utah Core standards, computer-adaptive testing, school grading, educator evaluation, Prosperity 2020 priorities, and effective instructional strategies in STEM.
