

Emery County School District

The Emery County School District was organized in 1915 and encompasses all of Emery County. The District Office is located in Huntington, Utah. Student enrollment is around 2,300 students. The District services six elementary schools, two junior high schools and two high schools. The District operates many programs in addition to regular education and extracurricular offerings. These alternatives include preschool training at three elementary schools, an adult education center, a comprehensive career and technical education program, and concurrent enrollment classes. Other offerings include advanced placement, special education, music & arts, and other programs in a variety of curriculum areas. The school buildings in our District are well maintained and a building renovation and replacement plan is in development. The District employs around 350 individuals in a variety of teaching and support positions.

Emery County

Emery County comprises an area of 4,439 square miles and is located in Central-Eastern Utah, approximately 150 miles south and east of Salt Lake City. Emery County is immediately south of Carbon County, and together, the Carbon-Emery area is the principal coal producing area in Utah. The basic economy of Emery County includes power generation, coal mining, livestock, and agriculture. The current County population is estimated at 10,600.

Most communities in Emery County are located mid-way between pristine forested mountains to the west, and the red-rock beauty of the San Rafael Swell to the east. Emery County is surrounded by many outstanding recreational areas, including Arches, Canyonlands and Capitol Reef National Parks, Lake Powell, Goblin Valley Stake Park, Huntington State Park, Millsite State Park, Cleveland-Lloyd Dinosaur Quarry, the San Rafael Swell, and the Manti-LaSal National Forest. Living in close proximity to these



locations, Emery County residents enjoy a variety of seasonal outdoor activities, including hiking, camping, biking, photography, hunting, fishing, golf, snowmobiling, wilderness exploring and summer water sports. An award-winning indoor/outdoor aquatic center is located in Castle Dale.



Cultural events include the Castle Valley Pageant, Emery County Fair, Southeastern Utah Livestock Show, Community Theater, and many other community celebrations of Independence Day, Pioneer Day, and other holidays and significant events. The campus of Utah State University-Eastern is located in Price, Utah—a traveling distance of an hour or less for Emery County residents.
