- Describe today's climate for elected officials.
- Has there ever been a political climate in which we are operating right now?
- What can we do to change that?



Board Meetings: Set the room temperature

- You can set the agenda.
- Nonverbal communication.
- Maintain a poker face.
- Establish the rules. Follow them.
- Be fair.
- Work with staff in advance to maintain rules, decorum.
- Play the long game.

TIPS and TRICK: Recognitions









Conversations: Set the tone.

- Respond affirmatively.
- Set a time limit for yourself.
- Don't allow yourself to be disrespected.
- Find common ground.
- Talk when you can best address their concerns.
- Remember that few conversations are 100 percent private.
- Provide context but don't argue.

- TIP and TRICKS: Ask questions
- "Can you give me specifics?"
- "What makes you say that?"
- "What would you like to see happen?"





Texts, emails: The 'Write' Way.

- Personalize with salutations.
- Express thanks.
- Broadly re-state their issue.
- Stick to the message.
- Set ground rules for responses.
- Remember that all emails and text messages can be forwarded. In fact, expect it.
- Ask for staff help if you need it.
- Assign staff to respond with approved responses.

- TIP and TRICKS: More honey, less vinegar.
- Thank you for reaching out with your thoughts ...
- Please know that much thought and deliberation went into the decision ...
- Rest assured this is the start of a robust public input process ...
- All this said, members of the Board of Education appreciate your input. It's valuable for us to hear the perspective of the parents of the students in our schools ...



Social Media, Press: Telling your story.



- Remember Framing Theory.

- Respond judiciously on social media.
