The Northeastern Utah Educational Services (NUES) Board of Directors is seeking qualified candidates for the position of Executive Director.

#### **JOB SUMMARY**

Under the direction of the NUES Board of Directors, the Executive Director is responsible for the efficient operation and use of resources including personnel assigned to the Regional Education Service Agency. The Executive Director is on a 220-day contract.

Northeastern Utah Educational Services (NUES) is one of Utah's four Regional Education Service Agencies established to assist school districts in providing equitable and cost-effective services and programs for students in rural Utah to match those offered to students on Utah's urban Wasatch-front. Utah State Code Section <u>53G-4-410</u> and Utah State Board of Education Rule R277-706.


The NUES service region spans seven (7) counties in the Northeast corner of Utah covering 13,263 square miles. NUES directly serves fourteen (14) local education agencies (LEAs) including nine (9) school districts and five (5) charter schools. The NUES region LEAs consist of 63 schools serving 33,065 students and employ 2,080 educators. LEAs in the NUES region span in size from 75 students to 8,793. NUES 2022-23 employee FTE count is 10.5.

# **AREA INFORMATION**

Situated 45 minutes from downtown Salt Lake City and 30 minutes from Provo, Heber City is only minutes from the world-renowned Deer Valley, Park City and Sundance ski resorts. Within the region are thirteen (13) state parks, acres of public forest and trails (Uinta-Wasatch-Cache National Forest and Ashley National Forest), a 2002 Olympic venue, a historic railroad, stunning golf courses, multiple lakes and reservoirs, blue ribbon fishing (Strawberry, Flaming Gorge etc.) and fantastic hunting. The NUES service region stretches 2.5 hours by car from Heber City in three different directions to Laketown in the North, Manila in the Northeast, and Vernal in the Southeast.
