

# **Legislative Interim Meetings**

Meetings were held May, 17, 2023, or as noted

### Administrative Rules Review and General Oversight Committee

May 18, 2023

#### **Alpine School District Operating Procedures**

Reviewed existing <u>statutes</u> regarding school closures with input from representatives and concerned parents from the Alpine School District. Discussed the motivation behind the state law and the need for additional clarification.

**Actions:** Referred the issue to the Education Interim Committee and opened a committee bill file addressing the issue.

Voted to issue a subpoena to the superintendent and chair of the Alpine School Board to appear before the committee during the next meeting.

#### **Equal Opportunity in High School Athletics**

Received a <u>presentation</u> from committee staff on federal Title IX regulations. Reviewed existing oversight and education mechanisms for local education agencies to appropriately protect students' rights to equal opportunity in athletic participation.

**Action:** Opened a committee bill file to address statelevel equal opportunity protections.

#### **Business and Labor**

#### 2023 Interim Study Items

Reviewed proposed 2023 interim <u>study items list</u> for the Business and Labor Interim Committee.

**Actions:** Amended and approved the proposed interim study item list by adding four additional study items related to an alcohol study, artificial intelligence, licensure by endorsement, and workers' compensation.

Granted the chairs authority to open committee bill files for items on the list.

#### **Bank Failure**

Discussed bank failures at Silicon Valley Bank and Signature Bank. Received information related to:

- failure causation;
- how the Department of Financial Institutions oversees Utah's banking industry;
- how the health of financial institutions is measured;
- the health status of Utah's financial institutions; and
- unique market or industry protections or weaknesses unique to Utah-based financial institutions.

Heard from the Department of Financial Institutions, Utah Bankers Association, Utah Credit Union Association, and Utah Association of Financial Services.

#### **Involuntary Corporate Dissolution**

Examined the involuntary corporate dissolution and reinstatement processes at the Division of Corporations and Commercial Code (division). A domestic entity may be dissolved for failure to file its annual report or maintain a registered agent. The committee discussed circumstances when an entity may be unknowingly dissolved yet in good standing with the State Tax Commission. The committee discussed requiring the division and State Tax Commission to verify and share information to prevent dissolving an entity that is operating in good faith. Heard from the division and State Tax Commission.

#### **Labor Laws**

Discussed how state law for working hours of minor employees conflicts with federal regulations. Discussed potential remedies, including legislation to deconflict state law and submitting a waiver to the federal government to exempt the state from federal minor hour regulations. Received a presentation from staff.

**Action:** Voted to open a committee bill file to deconflict state minor labor laws with federal regulations or seek a federal waiver for a state exemption.

### Draft Legislation: Joint Resolution Extending Emergency Powers for Flood Mitigation & Infrastructure Rehabilitation

#### **Revenue and Taxation**

#### 2023 General Session Recap

Received a <u>presentation</u> from committee staff on several bills passed during the 2023 General Session that changed tax policy.

#### **Committee Study Item List**

The committee reviewed the 2023 interim <u>study item list</u> approved by the Legislative Management Committee for the committee to study.

Action: <u>Amended</u> and approved the 2023 study item list, including the following four additional items to study:

- improvements to Truth in Taxation notices;
- Utah residents purchasing and registering recreational vehicles in other states to avoid Utah taxes;
- the use of lease revenue bonds by school districts; and
- the classification and taxation of certain snow utility vehicles known as "Snow Dogs."

#### **Economic and Revenue Outlook**

Received presentations from economists with the <u>Kem C. Gardner Policy Institute</u> and the <u>Office of the Legislative Fiscal Analyst</u> regarding updated state tax collections, revenue projections, and economic and employment indicators in the state.

#### Mineral Production Tax Withholding

The committee heard from the State Tax Commission on inconsistencies in the Utah code regarding withholding requirements for mineral producers. Recommendations were given to establish consistency with income tax withholding and reporting requirements.

**Action:** Opened a committee bill file to modify Utah code to harmonize the mineral production tax withholding rate with the income tax rate.

#### Sales Tax Remote Sales Transaction Test

Considered a recommendation from the State Tax Commission to consider removing the transactional threshold of 200 or more transactions for remote sellers to collect and remit sales tax in Utah. Currently, a business located outside of Utah that has 200 or more separate sales transactions in the state, or has gross sales in the state of \$100,000 or more, is required to collect and remit Utah sales tax.

**Action:** Opened a committee bill file to modify Utah code by removing the transactional threshold for remote sellers.

# 2023 First Special Session

Utah State Legislature | May 17, 2023

### Summary of considered legislation:

On May 17, 2023, the Utah Legislature convened in Special Session to consider four items.

<u>H.J.R. 101</u>, Joint Resolution Extending Emergency Powers for Flood Mitigation and Infrastructure Rehabilitation extends the expiration of the state of emergency established by Executive Order 2023-05 from May 18 to August 15, 2023.

<u>H.B. 1001</u>, *Emergency Response Funding* is the complementary bill to H.J.R 101 that specifies to which state agencies emergency response funding would be reallocated and appropriated.

<u>H.B. 1002</u>, *Restricted Persons Amendments* reverses changes enacted by H.B. 225 that were inconsistent with federal law regarding the possession of firearms by an alien with a nonimmigrant visa.

<u>H.B. 1003</u>, *Firefighter Death Benefits Amendments* corrects an oversight by adjusting the provisions of Tier 1 Firefighters' Retirement System – Division B to align with changes made to other Firefighter and Public Safety Retirement Systems in 2018 through <u>S.B. 21</u>, <u>Public Safety and Firefighter Retirement Death Benefit Amendments</u>.
