#### RESULTS FROM THE 2024 UTAH SMILE HEALTHY ORAL HEALTH SURVEY AMONG UTAH'S 3RD GRADERS AND WHY THE DATA MATTERS

Data drives what we do in education and knowing the BIG picture of our children's health is important and vital to their overall success. In the Fall of 2024 the Utah Department of Health and Human Services, Office of Primary Care and Rural Health, Oral Health Program randomly surveyed 3rd graders from 26 different school districts in Utah (25 urban schools and 25 rural schools). Dental disease causes more than just a hole in a tooth. It leads to discomfort, pain, poor nutrition, decreased self-esteem, poor sleep, chronic inflammation, lack of focus and more. Our children need us to discuss and understand this social determinant of health. Where do your children stand in the survey results?

Uintah School District has developed and implemented well-aligned instructional and teacher evaluation frameworks to improve student learning. The district supports these frameworks through a systematic professional learning plan that incorporates six-week cycles where district and school leaders and staff focus on specific components of the district's instructional framework. During each cycle, the district conducts regular school and classroom walkthrough observations and feedback is provided to school principals and instructional coaches. These frameworks, and the accountability associated with them, are raising the bar for student learning and proficiency on state assessments for students in the Uintah School District. Uintah's TREE Teacher Evaluation Framework is aligned to the Utah Effective Teaching Standards (UETS) and is based on current research on comprehensive teacher evaluation.

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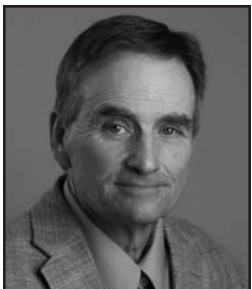
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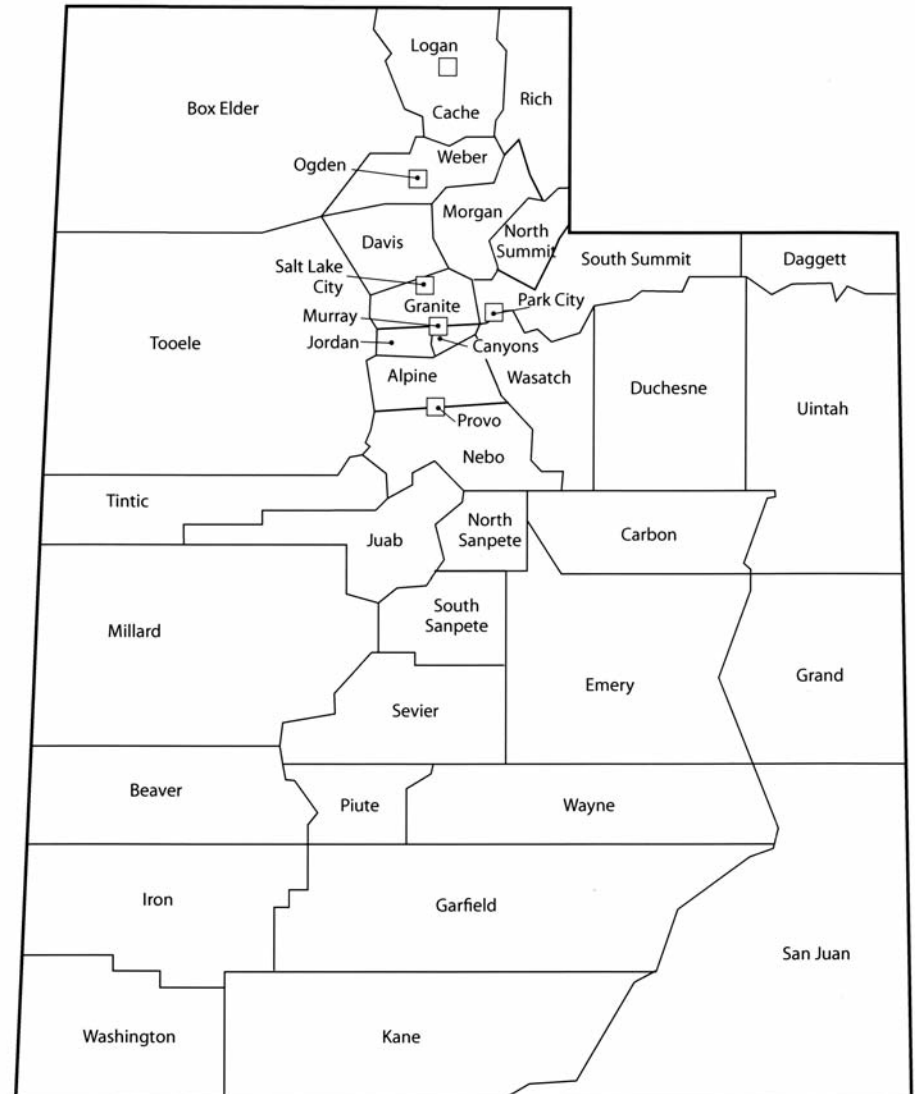
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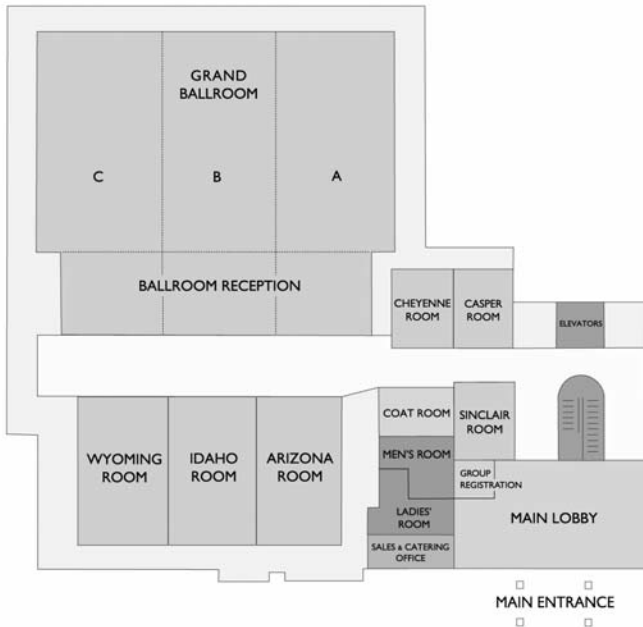

**Utah School Districts Map**

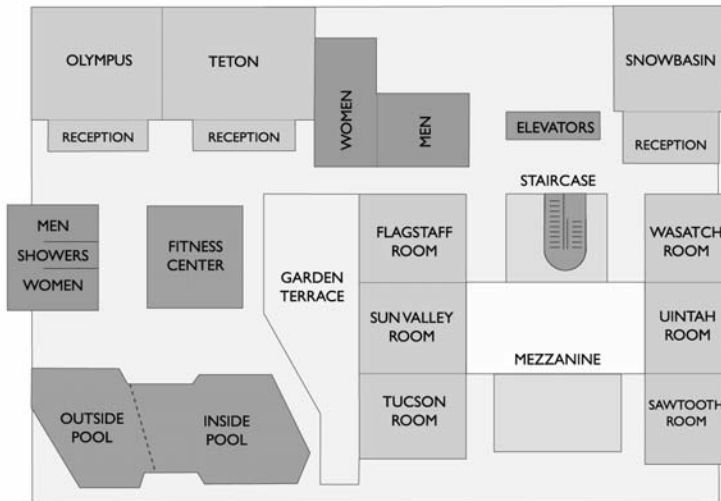


# Little America Hotel Floor Plan Map
