The Wasatch County School District Board of Education is seeking a highly qualified individual to serve as the next Superintendent of Schools.

This position will replace Superintendent Paul Sweat, who is retiring after 34 years of dedicated service to the district as a teacher, administrator, and superintendent. The Board is committed to selecting the most exceptional candidate to lead the district.

- A successful record of leading student achievement and leadership accomplishments.
